Students : Oh, we're so sorry, Mr. Bloom.

6. borrowing a car

Jane : **Do you think I could** borrow your car this weekend?

Sue : Normally I'd say no, but you are my best friend and I know you wouldn't ask for it if you didn't need it so much.

7. parking

Mary : **Is it alright if I** park here?
